Concert attire: Students need to wear nice clothing for the program, any color is fine. This is a time for them to show off all their hard work and we want students to look very nice doing so.




Student Lunch Bunches



Twice a month Stewart staff nominate students that demonstrate PRIDE. Those nominated have their names shared out during morning announcements, receive a pencil and certificate, have an award with their picture posted on our PRIDE board and get invited to our quarterly PRIDE party. Such a fun way to encourage and recognize positive behaviors!

Throughout February, our character trait focus will be understanding respect and how to go about showing it. Students will hear how showing respect to someone, themselves included, means acting in a way that shows they care about a person's feelings and well-being.

"Respect" can be a BIG concept for kids to grasp! They are most likely to gain the ability to demonstrate it when having these conversations at both school and home. Take time this month to talk with your child(ren) about what it means to be respectful.

Conversation starters at home:

How can you show respect in the classroom?

 Following classroom rules, listening when someone is speaking, using kind words, paying attention to the personal space of others, cleaning up messes

How can you show respect on the playground?

- Sharing, taking turns, playing by the rules, including others, keeping hands to self How can you show respect at home?
- Listening to others, following directions/rules, helping with chores, taking care of belongings and personal space, using words such as please and thank you How can you show self-respect?
 - Trying your best, standing up for yourself, avoiding things that could be harmful or dangerous, being prepared, being neat and clean

Stewart cubs do a GREAT JOB of showing respect! We are excited to see their growth in understanding and demonstration of this character trait.




